## Supply List

Fabric (see fabric placement diagram on back)		
	Blocks	12 completed 10-12" blocks
A	Block Background	1 ½ yds
B	Front Borders	1 ¼ yds
C	Front Sashing	¾ yd
D	Backside Blocks	3 yds or 12 Fat Quarters
E	Backside Borders	1 ¼ yds
F	Backside Sashing	½ yd
G	Binding	2/3 yd
	Batting	1 ½ yds (96" wide) or a Queen size Hobbs Heirloom <b>Fusible</b> Batting (see notes)

Other Supplies

### Before class:

- **DO NOT TRIM or square your finished blocks before class!**
- Remove batting from packaging and completely un-roll. Allow batting to "rest" flat overnight. You may also put the batting in the dryer on the fluff cycle (NO HEAT!) to relax and remove wrinkles.
- Cut (12) 17" X 17" squares from the batting. Save remaining batting for borders.
- Cut (12) 17" X 17" squares from fabric D.
- Don't worry if your batting and fabric squares are not perfect; we will be cutting them down later.
- Determine how you want to layout your blocks, and use the blue painter's tape to label them from 1 to 12.

### Notes:

- Please only use the **Hobb's Heirloom Fusible batting** available by the yard at Meissner's. Do not use polyester batting – you will not be happy with your finished quilt. If you cannot get the Hobb's fusible, you may use low-loft cotton batting and temporary adhesive spray such as Sulky KK2000.
- Do not rotary cut through more than 2 layers of batting at a time, and if possible, use an old rotary cutting mat or the back side of your mat because the batting will leave the mat furry.
- If your fabric is dark, you may want to use the smoke colored monofilament thread instead of the clear.
