

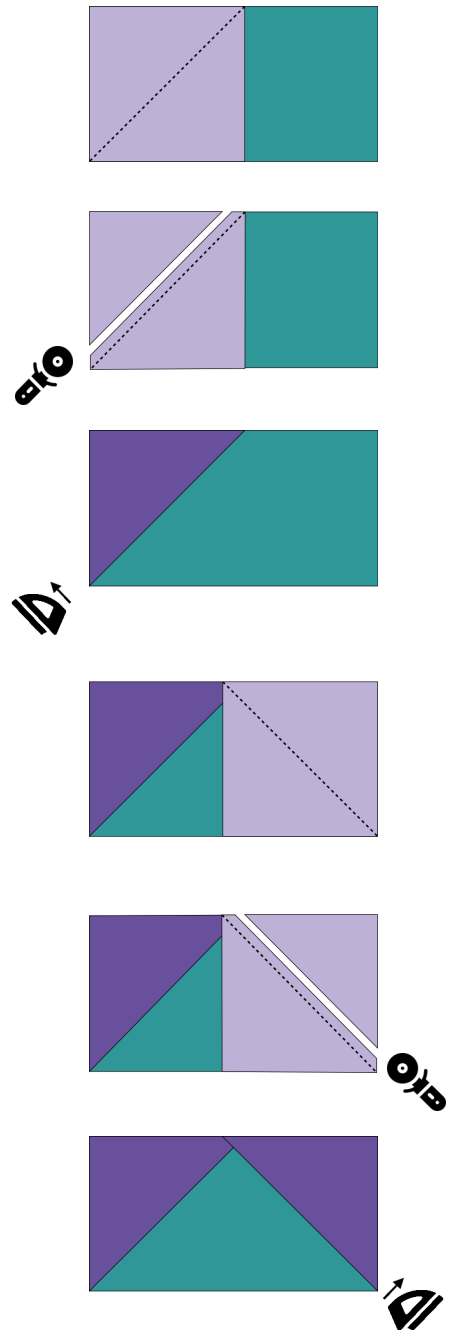
FLYING GEESE CHEAT SHEET

This method uses sew and flip corners with two squares and a rectangle.

Geese Unfinished Size	Geese Finished Size	Cut 1 Rectangle	Cut 2 Squares
1 ½ x 2 ½	1 x 2	1 ½ x 2 ½	1 ½
2 x 3 ½	1 ½ x 3	2 x 3 ½	2
2 ½ x 4 ½	2 x 4	2 ½ x 4 ½	2 ½
3 x 5 ½	2 ½ x 5	3 x 5 ½	3
3 ½ x 6 ½	3 x 6	3 ½ x 6 ½	3 ½
4 x 7 ½	3 ½ x 7	4 x 7 ½	4
4 ½ x 8 ½	4 x 8	4 ½ x 8 ½	4 ½
5 x 9 ½	4 ½ x 9	5 x 9 ½	5
5 ½ x 10 ½	5 x 10	5 ½ x 10 ½	5 ½
6 x 11 ½	5 ½ x 11	6 x 11 ½	6
6 ½ x 12 ½	6 x 12	6 ½ x 12 ½	6 ½

All measurements are in inches

- Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of each square.
- Place a square on the rectangle as shown, right sides together.
- Stitch on the drawn diagonal line.
- Trim the seam allowance to ¼”.
- Press toward the corner.
- Repeat with the other square.



Tip: To avoid fabric waste, sew the trimmed corner triangles into pairs to make half-square triangle units for another project!



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
